The Stone Barn - Town of Chase

The Stone Barn was built in 1903 by owner/architect Daniel E Krause. The mason was Wilhelm Mensenkamp. It is located on Cty Rd S in the Town of Chase. The barn is on the State and National Register of Historic Places and is one of the last surviving all-fieldstone barns in the country. It was also nominated to be on America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places list for 2009 through the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The barn measures 60 ft wide by 100 ft long. Its walls are made of solid fieldstone and mortar and are two feet thick. The stones were picked by hand from local farm fields over a century ago, however, their origin was the Canadian Shield. Massive glaciers pushed and tumbled the rock to the Wisconsin region during three known ice ages over the past 70,000 years, carving out much of Wisconsin's landscape, rivers, and lakes.

The Town of Chase purchased the barn in 2007 so they could protect it and make the property into an historic park. After the restorations are complete, the large threshing area of the barn will be used as a venue for all types of public and private events. Antique farm equipment will be displayed along the edge of the loft for viewing below. The large stable area will be a rustic museum which will showcase the lifestyles of the early settlers in the area, and also educate people about the geology of Wisconsin.
